


Speed boats at Weirs Beach, late 1920s. These races were sponsored by Jim Irwin and the Winnipesaukee Power Boat Association with the active assistance of Sam Dunsford of Concord, and Archie Gulliford of "724 Cigar" fame in Manchester. These gentlemen made special arrangements with the driver by offering them free gas to run their race boats, and with the Boston & Maine Railroad to commute people from Boston to Weirs Beach for the races. This event was very popular for many years.
